IMGResizer

This app helps you resize your website's images easily, quickly and comfortably.

This application was made for you if:

- *you are a system administrator*
- *you have a website and you store a lot of (large) images there*
- *you have a website and your users keep uploading large pictures*
- *you want a simple easy to use resizer*
- *you would you like to "free up" space*
- *you do not have time to resize every single image by yourself*

Evidently, you can use it in any other case (a great image resizer is always come in handy).

WHY IS IT WORTH YOUR MONEY?

This app allows you to resize your images and free up valuable space. You only have to set a password before using it and enter this safe and secure password before you start the resize. It's for your own safety; this method guarantees that no one else but you can resize your pictures.

While the resizer does its job, you can do anything you like. You do not even have to sit in front of your computer, however, make sure not to

close your browser before the resizer finishes or else the process will be interrupted.

ATTENTION: *the resize is permanent! Once you resized a picture, there's no way to restore the original size!*

This app resizes the images permanently. If you might want the original sized pictures later, backup your images, otherwise you will lose the original sized pictures forever. All images will be resized to a smaller size. The images will not be resized right before displaying them (so there won't be a bigger image), it's not an "on the fly" resizer. Please note this before you start using the app.

The app is EOL.

Some things you cannot do with IMG RESIZER:

- *you cannot upload pictures (these have to be there already)*
- *you cannot download pictures*
- *you cannot restore the resized pictures*
- *you cannot resize pictures outside your site (e. g.: You uploaded the app to your site but you want to resize the images on your Flickr account, or any other site you do not own.)*
- *you cannot adjust the size of the pictures will be uploaded in the future. After you uploaded a new, large file, you have to use the resizer again to make it smaller. It is suggested you use IMG RESIZER frequently to keep your maximum free space available.*

Requirements

- *PHP 5.2.0 with PECL json 1.2.0 or higher*
- *Javascript capable browser*



How to Use

1. Open the .php file
2. Set your password
Search the file and edit “user” and “pass”.
Enter something that you can keep in mind but others will not guess easily.

```
//Change these two for safety!!!
$user = „user”;
$password = „pass”;
```

NOTE: try to avoid simple passwords, e.g.: password, 1234.
They're easily hacked.

Save the file.

3. Upload the IMG RESIZER to your website via FTP or CPANEL file manager
4. Open your browser, enter the URL to the resizer.
If you put the file to the “/uploads/img -resize” folder, your URL should look like this:

5. Enter your password

6. Set your desired sizes and options
7. Wait for the resizer to finish
8. Enjoy your smaller pictures and the much bigger free space!
